ADMISSION REGULATION OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Regulation code: UMFST-REG-16 Edition 13

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In accordance with the provisions of the Higher Education Act and other legal provisions in force regarding the general framework for the organization and conduct of admission to the bachelor's degree cycle and for the purpose of applying unitary norms for the organization and conduct of the admission competition, in the spirit of the principle of university autonomy, the admission to the George Emil Palade University of Medicine, Pharmacy, Science and Technology of Târgu Mureș is done in compliance with the provisions below.

Chapter I. Introduction. Mediatization of the university and information for candidates

Art. 1. The University will be mediatized through the newspapers and television. In order to inform the candidates, is organized the admission panel, where will be presented informations, recommendations and indications for candidates. Also, in advance details will be brought in the attention of the candidates in order to inform them on how they must prepare for the competition tests and the rules they must comply with during the tests. The information is also displayed on the university's website (www.umfst.ro, [Adminfo.umfst.ro platform](#)).

Art. 2. A pre-admission session can be organized for the 3 and 4-year study programs within the university.

Chapter II. Admission Committee

Art. 3. In order to coordinate the admission competition activity, will be established the University Admission Commission. The Commission appointment will be made by decision of the Rector, which includes members of the Administrative Board, teaching and research staff, auxiliary teaching and research staff and students. The university admission commission is headed by the Rector and is full responsible for proper organization and conduct of the competition, respectively for the observance of the legality and ensures the security of the activity in all stages of its preparation and conduct.

Art. 4. The admission commission for the faculties of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy will be headquartered in the University's Hypnos accommodation facilities.

Art. 5. The access of persons who do not have duties in the conduct of the admission contest is prohibited at the headquarters of the admission commission.

Art. 6. The Admission Commission president, establishes the necessary working groups, involving in activity both the teaching and research staff, as well as the teaching and auxiliary research staff. The composition of these groups will not include persons who:

- a) are spouses, relatives or relatives up to and including the third degree, with one or more candidates;
- b) are associated with a candidate in companies in which they each hold shares representing at least 10% of the company's capital;
- c) benefits or have benefited, in the last 5 years prior to the competition, benefits or services of any nature from a candidate.

Art. 7.

(1) The admission competition shall be organized both for the occupation of the number of places under subsidy public funds, which are approved by Order of the Minister of Education and Research, and under the regime with a fee subsidized by the university, and with a fee – places proposed by the University Senate and approved by the Ministry of Education and Research.

(2) The University shall grant financed study places, within the approved enrollment figure, both in the bachelor's degree and in the master's, degree programs, to graduates with a high school diploma coming from the ranks of:



- a) national minorities, for study programs that do not exist in state higher education in the language of the respective minority;
- b) the social protection system;
- c) persons with disabilities.

If the places are not filled, they will be redistributed for other candidates.

Art. 8. The admission contest is organized in two sessions. The organization of the second session is made only for filling the places remaining vacant after the first session.

Art. 9. The entrance exam is organized as follows:

- for 5 and 6 - year study programs of the faculties of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy – a grid test;
- for the 3 and 4 -year study programs (except for the Physical Education and Sports study program) – based on the average calculated after the evaluation of the file according to the criteria established by each faculty;
- at the Architecture study program in English – a practical graphic representation test.

Art. 10. All staff involved in the activity for admission competition - the teaching, research, administrative and secretarial staff - will be trained before the written test.

Chapter III. Registration of candidates and conditions for participation in the competition

Art. 11. The registration of candidates for the admission contest in first year study, for all study programs, is made during the period announced on the university's website, exclusively through the online registration platform.

Art. 12. High school graduates with a baccalaureate diploma or a diploma equivalent to it can register for the competition, regardless of the year of high school graduation.

Art. 13. Candidates in the last year of high school (XII or XIII grade) which are going to take the baccalaureate exam in the current year; candidates who already hold the baccalaureate diploma from previous years; and candidates who hold a bachelor's degree and they wish to attend a second faculty can enroll in the Pre-Admission Program. The candidate will be admitted to the study program for which he/she has opted after taking the baccalaureate exam and submitting the diploma to the faculty secretariat.

Art. 14. Citizens of the member states of the European Union and of the states belonging to the European Economic Area and the Swiss Confederation may apply for admission to all cycles of university studies, under the same conditions provided by law for the Romanian citizens, including the terms of tuition fees. The recognition of the studies carried out by them outside Romania will be carried out by the National Center for Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas (C.N.R.E.D.) of the Ministry of Education and Research. The candidates before registering for the admission competition, has the obligation to present the certificate of recognition of studies.

Candidates whose option is for the places reserved for the Roma ethnicity will bring a recommendation issued by a legal Roma organization (signed and stamped), which certifies that the candidate belongs to this ethnicity. The distribution of public financed places for Roma candidates will be made according to what is transmitted Ministry of Education and Research.

According to the law, the university establishes measures on equal opportunities for people with disabilities, ensuring, where necessary, additional support adapted to the needs of adults with disabilities to support their access in the university.



Art. 15.

(1) Upon admission to university studies taught in Romanian language, foreign citizens have the obligation to present a certificate of linguistic competence for the Romanian language issued by the competent institutions of the Ministry of Education and Research. By exception, for students who have studied in a language of international circulation or in a language of national minorities, the certification of linguistic competences of oral communication in Romanian is made with the high school diploma, issued by the authorized/accredited educational units in Romania.

At the candidate's written request for bachelor's degree programs taught in Romanian language, the admission competition may also be held in the candidate's mother tongue, in compliance with university autonomy.

(2) For university studies organized in the mother tongue/in a foreign language, admission shall be held in the language of the university study program.

Upon admission to bachelor's degree studies taught in a foreign language, candidates are required to present an international recognized language proficiency certificate for the language for the chosen study program. If they don't hold a certificate, candidates can obtain it for their linguistic competences for the foreign language within the Center for Applied Linguistic Research and Cultural Studies (CCLASC) or the Medlingua Language Center of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș. Exceptions are candidates who present study documents issued by educational institutions in Romania or abroad with teaching in the respective foreign language.

(3) Graduates of high school education at international systems accredited and recognized by the Ministry of Education and Research, have the right to participate in the admission process in the Romanian higher education system, including from the year of graduation of high school studies, through a conditional acceptance procedure. The admitted candidate will bring the equivalent International High School diploma within a maximum 6 months from the admission.

Art. 16. Candidates can opt for a single study program in the field of Health and for a maximum of 3 study programs within the faculties: Engineering and Information Technology, Sciences and Letters "Petru Maior" and Economics and Law, being required to submit a separate file for each chosen study program and pay the registration fee separately for each file submitted.

Art. 17. Candidates enrolled in the Military Medicine, General Military Nursing, Military Dentistry, Military Pharmacy sections, if they will not be admitted to these sections, will be classified in the order of the obtained average at admission within the university study programs of General Nursing, Dental Medicine, and Pharmacy, with the payment of a single registration fee.

Art. 18. In military field, intelligence, public order and national security higher education, admission to all cycles of university studies is also carried out in compliance with the specific regulations developed by the relevant ministries.

To register for the competition, candidates will access the online registration platform on the main page of the university's website, where they will create an account and fill the registration file.

By filling the online registration file, the candidate assumes responsibility for the declarations made, including the fact that he/she has become aware of the content of the Regulations for the organization and conduct of the admission contest in the bachelor's cycle, as well as the obligation to constantly follow the communications made regarding the contest on the university's website.

The registration files of the candidates enrolled in the sections: Military Medicine, General Military Medical Assistance, Military Dental Medicine, Military Pharmacy, will be validated for compliance with the specific regulations of the Ministry of Defense by the Medical-Military Institute.



The final lists with the results obtained by the candidates will be displayed at the university's headquarters and will be sent to the Medical-Military Institute to the imm@mapn.ro address.

Art. 19. To register for the competition, candidates will access the online registration platform on the main page of the university's website, where they will create an account and fill in the registration file. By filling in the registration file Online, the candidate assumes responsibility for the declarations made, including the fact that he or she has become aware of the content of these regulations for the organisation and conduct of the competition for admission to the bachelor's degree cycle, as well as the obligation to constantly follow the communications made regarding the competition at the Admission Panel and on the university's website. www.umfst.ro, and [Adminfo.umfst.ro platform](http://Adminfo.umfst.ro)).

Art.20. The University management may decide to organize the online of the entrance exams.

Art. 21. The following documents must be attached to the registration file, by uploading them on the registration platform Online:

- High School diploma or equivalent. The high school graduates of the promotion of the year in which the admission takes place may present, instead of the baccalaureate diploma, a certificate issued by the educational institution mentioning the general average, the averages obtained in the years of study, the validity period and the fact that the diploma has not been issued. The candidates in the above-mentioned category declared admitted following the competition have the obligation to submit to the faculty secretariat the high school diploma, in original, by a date established by the University Management;
- Transcript/Certificate from the institution where the candidate attended/is attending high school which indicates the average of the grades of the years of study in year IX-XI and the average of the grades of the years of study in the discipline relevant to the field of admission, in year IX-X or IX-XI (depending on the years in which the subject studied the relevant disciplines). This document is required only for candidates enrolling in the Pre-admission and to the 3 and 4-year study programs and the Architecture study program in English;
- Certificate of recognition of studies carried out by citizens of the Member States of the European Union and of the states which belongs to the European Economic Area and the Swiss Confederation, if applicable;
- Birth certificate;
- Copy of the identity document (Identity Card or Passport) within the validity period;
- Standard medical certificate, issued by the family doctor's office or by the school doctor. Candidates with chronic conditions will endorse the certificate issued by their family doctor by a specialist in the field. Failure to declare these conditions entails the institutional consequences in force;
- Psychiatric examination from the specialist (only for 5 and 6-year study programs belonging to the health field, showing that they are suitable for the profile or specialization to which they apply);
- The recommendation, issued by a legal organization of the Roma ethnicity (signed and stamped), attesting the candidate's belonging to this ethnicity, in the case of candidates who register for the places designated for the Roma ethnicity;
- Candidate's photo, in electronic format;
- Proof of payment of the registration fee;
- Affidavit regarding the correctness of the submitted documents;



- Supporting documents regarding the justification of the request for exemption from the payment of registration fees:

- the death certificate of the parent / attestations / documents showing the situation of a single-parent family, illness, disability, poverty;
- certificate confirming his/her own status as an employee in activity or retired from the education system;
- certificate confirming the status of employee of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș.

The following candidates are exempt from paying the registration fee for admission competitions to higher education and benefit, after enrollment, from free accommodation in dormitories and boarding schools:

- a) children of active or retired personnel from the education system;
- b) employees of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș;
- c) children with one or both deceased parents;
- d) children from single-parent families;
- e) persons at risk of losing their ability to meet their daily living needs due to situations of illness, disability, poverty.

Exemptions from points (a), (c), (d) and (e) are granted only to candidates who are not over the age of 25. Fee exemptions apply for enrollment in one or more study programs.

Art. 22. Candidates who have obtained, during their high school studies, distinctions (prizes I, II, III at the National Biology Olympiad organized by M.E.C. or at international school Olympiads recognized by M.E.C. and/or first prize at national Olympiads, organized by Ministry of Education and Research in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science, Robotics or an Olympiad in the field of the study program for which he/she enrolls).

Art. 23. For candidates declared admitted, the high school diploma or its equivalent, the transcript or its equivalent and the birth certificate will be presented in original or a true copy of the original at the time of confirmation of registration.

Art. 24.

(1) A candidate may be admitted and enrolled as a student in no more than two study programs at the same time, regardless of the study cycle and the educational institutions that offer them (except for programs in the medical-pharmaceutical field, where candidates can be enrolled in only one program); a candidate declared admitted may benefit from funding from the budget for only one bachelor's program, in compliance with the legal provisions in force, submitting the original baccalaureate diploma to the faculty he wishes to attend.

(2) The person who has benefited free tuition within a university study program financed from the state budget has, under the conditions of the law, the right to follow another university study program within the same cycle of university studies:

- a) on a fee-pay basis, if the state higher education institution organizes the program in this way as well;
- b) free of charge, with funding from the state budget, provided that the person pays the equivalent value of the schooling services he or she previously benefited from with funding from the state budget, in whole or in part, in cases where the study program to which he or she was admitted is organized only with full funding from the budget. Students can pay the equivalent value of the schooling services they have previously benefited from to the Ministry of Education, according to the methodology approved by the Order of the Minister of Education no. 5496/2024 of 9 July 2024.



Art. 25. All candidates, including married candidates will be registered for the competition with the names on their birth certificates. In order to avoid misunderstandings, when carrying out identification operations based on the identity card, it is necessary that the name on the birth certificate is also written (in parenthesis) on the marriage certificate, adoption certificate or the one provided for in court decisions changing the name or surname, the initial being that of the father's first name, as the case may be, of the mother.

Art. 26. In order to inform candidates, the number of places per faculties and study programs will be displayed, as well as the daily dynamics of candidate registrations.

Art. 27. Each candidate, after validating the registration, will print his registration form and the competition card.

Art. 28. After the final close of the registration, the nominal lists of the registered candidates will be drawn up, in alphabetical order, and will be displayed in a visible place, at least 24 hours before the start of the test which will include the faculty, the study program, the language in which the tests are held and the distribution in the competition rooms. Any notification of the candidates regarding the existence of inaccuracies of the data specified on these tables is immediately verified, the necessary corrections being made directly on the displayed lists, at the latest 3 hours before the start of the test, with the approval of the Rector of the university.

Chapter IV. Specific aspects of admission to study programs in the field of Health

IV.I. Preparation the halls for the conduct of written tests

Art. 29. In order to conduct the written tests, the supervision will be carried out by drawing lots of teaching and research staff and of auxiliary teaching and research staff. For each hall will be established a hall manager, one with grid sheets and questionnaires, as well as a sufficient number of supervisors, no less than three people in a hall. The draw will be made on computer, three hours before the test, when the distribution on the halls and taking into account the composition by nationality of the candidates.

Art. 30. In the room established by the Admission Commission the hall managers with the supervisors and those responsible for the writing sheets, will be present one and a half hours before the start of the test.

Art. 31. After communicating the halls to which they have been assigned, the room managers and those with the writing sheets will immediately go to the headquarters of the local commission to take the materials and, together with the supervisors, will go to the respective halls.

Art. 32. The competition halls will be previously adapted to the conditions that are required to ensure security during the tests by:

- elimination of any teaching and other material;
- displaying the nominal table, on the entrance door, with the candidates assigned to the respective hall;
- fixing the seat of each candidate according to the order displayed by sticking a copy of the candidate's competition card.

Art. 33. Each person in charge of the hall will receive under signature, before each competition test, the following materials:

- nominal table with the candidates assigned to the respective hall;
- a grid type sheet model, regarding the completion of the header headings;
- minutes form for filling in the data with the presence of the candidates and the settlement of the grid sheets (on the back of the minutes will record the presence of the supervisors in the room);



- indications for candidates, which will be read before the start of the test;
- pre-stamped sheets for drafts;
- minicomputers (for the Organic Chemistry test).

Art. 34. Candidates' access to the competition room is allowed one hour before the start of the test.

Art. 35. Upon the candidates' entry into the halls, the hall manager, assisted by the supervisory staff, verifies candidates identity, based on valid identity card/passport, the competition card and the nominal table of the candidates assigned to the respective room, and will be recorded their presence.

Art. 36. Candidates who do not have all the required documents are not admitted to the exam hall. In case of force majeure, the president of the admission committee may decide on the admission of these candidates in the examination room.

Art. 37. Candidates will occupy their seats only after they have left at the supervision committee desk any written materials or objects in which those materials could be stored.

Art. 38. The identification documents will remain on the candidate's table for the entire duration of the test, for check.

IV.II. Establishing the topics for the competition tests

Art. 39. The admission contest will be conducted on the basis of tests containing questions with answers to choose, in accordance with the competition regulations approved and communicated for the respective year.

Art. 40. The determination of the questions for the admission will be chosen from the list of the existing questions and it will be done by using a computer. For this has been developed a random number generator program, this ensures the fixing operation for security and objectivity of the topics.

Art. 41. The start time of the written tests will be established in relation to the time needed for verification, multiplication and transmission of the admission questions to the halls. Any person who participates or assists in the establishing the topics, multiplying them, etc. is not allowed to leave the headquarters of the central commission before the expiry of the time allowed for the elaboration of the works by the candidates in all the competition rooms.

Art. 42. The established topics will be generated in four variants, using a computer program.

Art. 43. After establishing and developing the four questionnaire variants, they are multiplied, corresponding to the number of candidates. The grid-type sheets are multiplied, in four variants, in a number of copies by at least 30% more than the number of candidates.

Art. 44. Then will proceed to the preparation of the competition folders related to each room assigned with candidates; the schemes for the arrangement of candidates in the room are considered, which contain data on the number of candidates, per competition tests, and the number of variants I, II, III and IV of the questionnaires, both in Romanian and in Hungarian. The introduction of questionnaires and grid sheets in envelopes is done under the control of the dean by two people. They are responsible for the accuracy of the number of forms in envelopes.

Art. 45. A copy of the candidates' classroom layout scheme will also be included in the envelope, which will contain data on the number of questionnaire variants with required questions in each of the two languages. In a separate envelope, will be inserted spare grid sheets (for situations when it is necessary to cancel some works). The envelopes thus prepared are signed by the Rector of the university or the president of the central admission commission, is applied the control stamp, is fixed the time of opening the envelopes, after which they are taken to the competition halls by groups of teaching staff established by decision of the Rector of the university.



Art. 46. During the written tests, the groups of teaching staff who participated in fixing the topics will develop the grids with the correct answers, and it will be displayed on the admission panel after the end of the exam. The persons participating at these collectives do not have the right to enter in the competition halls or to communicate with the persons who have access to those halls.

IV.III. Receiving and distributing questionnaires with questions. Clarifications regarding the conduct of the written test.

Art. 47. The person in charge of the hall, in the presence of the person in charge of the writing sheets and the supervisors, receives the envelopes with the questionnaires with the tests and the grid sheets, as well as the envelope with spare sheets; checks the integrity of the stamp on each envelope; signs the receipt and ensures to open them.

Art. 48. The time set for opening the test envelopes will be the same for all rooms where the same exam test is held. All teaching staff participating at the opening of the envelopes with the questionnaire will sign clearly the envelopes. The envelope will be handed to the local admission commission at the end of the test.

Art. 49. From the moment the test envelope is opened, no candidate can enter in the exam hall. No candidate may leave the exam hall until 60 minutes after the distribution of the questionnaires and only after handing the grid sheet and signing for its handover. Candidates who are not in the hall at the time of opening the envelopes with subjects lose the right to take the respective contest.

Art. 50. In order to eliminate the possibility of communication between candidates, both on the side and antero-posterior, the distribution of the questionnaires with questions will take into account the layout of the room, already introduced in the envelope with questionnaires. When generating the room layout scheme, the following model is taken into account:

- row I – 1, 2, 3, 4;
- row II – 3, 4, 1, 2;
- row III \equiv row I;
- row IV \equiv row II and so on.

Art. 51. The candidates' attention is drawn to check the match of the questionnaires with the grid-type sheets regarding the correspondence of the Roman numerals to them (I with I, II with II, III with III and IV with IV).

Art. 52. The indications will be read to the candidates after the questionnaires and the grid sheets are distributed.

Art. 53. The time allocated for the elaboration of the written test is 3 hours, calculated from the moment when the questionnaires and the grid sheets are distributed to all candidates and the necessary indications regarding the conduct of the written test were given.

Art. 54. The person in charge of the hall will communicate the exact time at which the elaboration of the work begins and the time at which it will end. This data will also be written on the board.

Art. 55. The marker pencil, received in the competition room, will be used only for the elaboration of the written work, and for completing the grid sheet. The data in the candidate's identification corner shall be filled in with a pen. The same writing tools are also used for drafting sheets.

Art. 56. Candidates will take care in filling the answers on the grid sheets by marking only the correct answers. The correct answers are marked by filling in (completely hatching) the circles next to the letters whose definitions in the questionnaire are considered to be the correct answers. For true/false questions, the circle corresponding to the true or



false character of the question will be filled in (only circle A if the statement is considered true or only circle F if the statement is considered false). The rest of the circles will remain unmarked.

Art. 57. The questionnaire does not specify the number of correct answers to the questions. By generating the variants by the computer, the questions will be intercalated. Only the questions with correct answers are scored.

Art. 58. During the test, the person in charge of the hall and the other supervisors will not discuss with the candidates or will not discuss with each other.

Art. 59. If some candidates, for various reasons, wish to transcribe their paper, without exceeding the time allotted for the test, they can do so, the sheet initially used to be cancelled on the spot, with the signature of the person in charge of the hall. The new grid sheet given to the candidate will be shown to the room to confirm that it is blank. The cancelled grid sheets are settled with the delivery of the written works and must correspond the number, by types of variants, to the number of grid sheets received from the admission committee.

Art. 60. Entail the cancellation of the paper the inscription of the candidates' names on the grid-type sheets outside the section intended for this purpose, as well as marking of other distinctive signs.

Art. 61. Any proven attempt of fraud during the competition is sanctioned with the elimination of the respective candidates from the competition, mentioning in all documents „eliminated from the competition". It is also fraud if the candidates, through various signs or notes, try to communicate with each other regarding the questions in the questionnaires.

Art. 62. During the tests, only delegated persons by the Rector of the university can enter in the competition halls.

Art. 63. The hall managers and supervisors may not leave the halls where they have been assigned during the written tests, regardless of the reason, the exit of a supervisor from the room will be recorded in a report, specifying the time of exit and the time of return. If necessary, the leaving person will be accompanied by another person, designated by the hall manager in charge.

IV.IV. Management of written works

Art. 64. As they conclude their tests, the candidates hand them over to the hall managers, they will sign and affix the stamp to the upper right corner of the paper, and the candidate signs in the nominal table regarding the delivery of the paper.

Art. 65. Candidates who at the end of the time allotted for the test, have not finished the paper, will submit it in the phase in which they are, it is forbidden to exceed the time set for the elaboration of the papers. At the end of the time allotted for the written test, no less than three candidates may remain in the hall. The submission of the papers will be done in order, the candidates will present the completed grid sheet; and it is not allowed to fill in the grid in while waiting in line. The handedover grid sheets will be placed in the envelopes received from the local admission commission, which will be glued (sealed) and signed by the hall managers, the sheet managers and the last three candidates left in the room.

Art. 66. The questionnaires with questions remain at the candidates.

Art. 67. After the completion of the collection of the written papers, the hall manager, accompanied by two members of the supervisory team, will take the written papers, drafts, cancelled grid sheets, unused grid sheets, to the headquarters of the local admission commission and will hand them over, under signature, to the two secretaries of the admission commission. The number of grid sheets completed, cancelled and left free must coincide with the one initially received from the local admission commission. The settlement of the grid sheets received will be made on the form received from the secretariat of the local admission commission. The cancelled grid sheets and the sheets used as drafts



are handed over separately to the secretaries of the local admission commission and are not taken into account when verifying and assessing the written papers. The two secretaries, assisted by the member of the admission commission responsible for the record of the questionnaires with tests and the grid sheets, will ensure the further management, throughout the correction and resolution of the appeals, of the written works and documents generated by these operations.

IV.V. Correction of the papers and the necessary documents regarding their recording

Art. 68. The correction of the papers will be done by computer.

Art. 69. The grade for the paper is obtained by converting the points into grades according the rules specified in the procedure for conducting the admission exam for the current year.

Art. 70. At the end of the correction of all the papers will be generated a list of the results of the test.

Art. 71. In the score sheets for the examinations and in the central summary sheet, both the number of points obtained by the candidate and the grade resulting from their conversion will be recorded.

Art. 72. The results of the correction will be recorded in grade catalogs, signed by the President of the admission commission.

Art. 73. After the completion of the action of correction and elaboration of the sheets on competition tests, will be recorded the grades on the papers passed; the grade obtained by transforming the points holographically, will be passed with the confirmation signature of the dean or his substitute.

Art. 74. The recording of final grades on the papers will be carried out by teams consisting of three persons.

Art. 75. The tables and reports regarding the results of the admission competition will be generated electronically.

Chapter V. Specific aspects of admission to study programs in the fields of *Physical Education and Sports, Educational Sciences and Philology*

V.I. Specific aspects of admission to the Physical Education and Sports study program

Art. 76. Conduct of the specific competition – practical tests: after the end of the registration period, the admission commission will display at least 24 hours before the start of the practical tests, the nominal lists in alphabetical order of the registered candidates.

Art. 77. Candidates have the obligation to verify the correctness of the data entered on the displayed lists and inform immediately the admission commission of any inconsistencies. No changes are made to the data specified in the displayed lists after the start of the specific competition.

Art. 78. The schedule and locations of the competition tests are displayed no later than the day before the start of the tests.

Art. 79. Candidates will present their identity card/passport and competition card before the start of each test. For the practical tests, candidates must wear sports equipment.

Art. 80. Establishing the final result of the admission competition – *Physical and sports education*. The general physical aptitude test is eliminatory. Candidates who have obtained at least an average of 5.00 in the general sports aptitude test will be qualified in the admission competition, even if they have obtained marks below 5.00 in one or more of the component tests.

Art. 81. The weights used in calculating the overall admission average are:



The average grade of the general physical aptitude test: 90% of the final average

Average of the baccalaureate exam: 10% of the final average.

The overall admission average is calculated for each candidate as an arithmetic mean, with two decimal places, without rounding.

In case of the existence of several candidates with an average equal to that of the last place initially assigned, they will be separated according to the following criteria:

1. – Average of general sporting aptitudes,
2. – The average of the baccalaureate exam.

Art. 82. Is mandatory to complete all the stages of admission.

Art. 83. No appeals are admitted for the practical tests.

Art. 84. Details related to the conduct of the tests, the scores awarded and the formulas for calculating the final admission average are provided in the specific procedure for admission to this study program.

V.II. Specific aspects of admission to study programs in the fields of *Educational Sciences* and *Philology*

Art. 85. The competition for admission to the study programs in the fields of *Educational Sciences* and *Philology* includes an eliminatory test of *Communication Skills and Aptitudes*.

Chapter VI. Specific aspects of admission to 3- and 4-year bachelor's degree programs

Art. 86. Candidates can enroll in only one study program/session in the field of Health and in a maximum of three study programs within the faculties Engineering and Information Technology, Sciences and Letters "Petru Maior" and Economics and Law. In this case, candidates will submit a separate file for each of the registrations and will also pay separate registration fees.

Art. 87. For each study program to which the candidate has applied, the allocation of state-funded places, university-subsidized fee places, and full-fee places will be made taking into account the overall admission average.

Art. 88.

(1) The Administrative Board has the right to establish for each study program from the tuition offer the minimum number of students necessary for the establishment of study groups, depending on the economic criteria of efficiency, as well as to proceed to the redistribution of candidates to the other study programs, in the case that tuition for certain study programs is not covered.

(2) Enrollment in a bachelor's degree program is established by the Decision of Administrative Board, after analyzing the results of the first admission session.

(3) Candidates enrolled in the bachelor's degree program that does not meet the condition given in para. (2) they can be redistributed to other bachelor's degree programs, depending on the candidates' option, within the limit of the available places and in descending order of the averages.

Art. 89.

(1) The classification of the candidates shall be made in descending order of the averages obtained at the admission exam, after each admission session and within the limit of the places approved for each study program, as follows:

For study programs to which Pre-admission is not organized: the average of the baccalaureate exam.



For study programs where Pre-admission is organized: $60\% \times$ arithmetic average of the years of study IX–XI + $40\% \times$ arithmetic average of the years of study in the subject relevant to the field of admission*

*grades IX and X or grades IX, X and XI (depending on the years in which the discipline relevant to the candidate's profile is studied)

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(2) In case of the existence of several candidates with an average equal to that of the last place initially assigned, the tie-breaking criteria shall be used:

1. Average years of study in the discipline relevant to the field of admission,
2. Arithmetic average of the years of study IX-XI.

(3) The ranking order resulting from each admission session will be used for the distribution by state budget funded places, university-subsidized fee places, and full-fee places, these being awarded to the candidates from each study program in descending order of the averages obtained, according to this Regulation. The hierarchy made after the first admission session cannot be modified by the results obtained in the subsequent admission sessions.

Art. 90. Candidates declared admitted which have not confirmed their places according to the admission calendar will be eliminated from the admission database, losing the occupied position. Candidates on the waiting list may be added to the lists in descending order of the averages obtained following participation in the admission process.

Chapter VII. Determination and display of the result of the competition

Art. 91. Admission to higher education is made strictly in descending order of the general averages obtained by the candidates, within the limit of the number of places for which the competition is organized.

Art. 92. The number of candidates declared admitted may not exceed the tuition amount allocated to the study program, both for state budget funded places, for university-subsidized fee places and full-fee places.

Art. 93. The overall averages obtained by candidates in the competition are valid for determining the ranking order only at the university, faculty, and study program to which they applied.

Art. 94. Candidates below the "admission line", in descending order of averages, can benefit for full fee-paying places, within the limit of the approved places.

Art. 95. In the field of Health at the 5 and 6-year study programs, the classification of candidates will be made in descending order of the averages obtained at the entrance exam, in which a weight of 90% will be the grade from the written test and 10% from the average from the baccalaureate exam. In case of the existence of several candidates with an average equal to that of the last place initially assigned, they shall be separated according to the following criteria:

1. – the grade for the written test,
2. – average at the baccalaureate exam.

Art. 96. The minimum general admission average cannot be less than 5.00 (five) and will be calculated with two decimals, without rounding.

Art. 97. The results of the admission competition, verified and approved by the admission committee, they are brought to the attention of those concerned by posting in a visible location., where they remain for 45 days, and on the university's website (www.umfst.ro) – provisional lists.

Art. 98. If a candidate renounces the student status obtained through the competition before the start of the academic year, the vacant place will be filled in the following order:



- a. by one of the rejected candidates, with an overall average equal to that of the last candidate declared admitted, applying the tie-breaking criteria mentioned above;
- b. by one of the unsuccessful candidates, with an overall average greater than or equal to the minimum permissible average, established by its own regulations, considering the list in strictly descending order of the averages;
- c. through a new admission competition, within the second session, for the unoccupied places from the first session.

Chapter VIII. Submission and resolution of appeals

Art. 99. Appeals regarding the exam subjects must be submitted exclusively to the University Registry, addressed to the University Admission Committee, within the first 2 hours after the correct answer grids are posted. Appeals regarding the result of the written test must be submitted within a maximum of 48 hours from the date and time of posting the competition results.

Art. 100. Higher education institutions are the only ones authorized to decide on the merits of the appeals. If the appeals are accepted, the initial grade is modified, regardless of the size of the marking difference.

Art. 101. The candidate who has been admitted the appeal acquires the status of student if he obtains a higher overall average than that of the last candidate initially admitted. If he/she obtains an average equal to that of the last candidate initially admitted, the established tie-breaker criteria shall apply.

Art. 102. Appeals are not allowed for oral, sports or artistic aptitude tests.

Art. 103. After the expiry of the deadline for solving and responding to the appeals (no more than 3 days from the expiry of the deadline for submitting them), the result of the admission contest is considered final and can no longer be modified.

Art. 104. It is the competence of the *Ethics Committees* of the universities to analyze the appeals or complaints regarding the activity of the teaching staff (correctors, examiners, supervisors or admission commissions). In case of complaint or contestation of admission irregularities produced by teaching staff, the Admission Committee requests the Rector to convene the Ethics Committee to analyze the case and make the appropriate decision. The Admission Committee may also act on its own initiative.

Art. 105. Appeals may not be submitted and received for the higher hierarchical bodies only regarding the organization of the competition, in relation to the general criteria developed by the Ministry of Education and Research.

Art. 106. After the resolution of the appeals, the final lists are posted, which will include the final and indisputable results.

Chapter IX. Enrollment in the first year of study

Art. 107.

(1) The enrollment of the candidates admitted in the first year of studies shall be made after the resolution of the appeals and the confirmation of the place.

(2) The candidates declared admitted to the state funded places will pay the registration fee and will sign the schooling contract.

(3) Candidates declared admitted to the university-subsidized fee places will pay the amount of the registration fee and will sign the schooling contract.

(4) The candidates declared admitted to the full-fee places will pay the amount of the registration fee, the first installment of the tuition (1/4 of the tuition fee) and will sign the schooling contract.



(5) After confirming the places, are generated and displayed the final lists, with the candidates declared admitted and confirmed, who will enroll.

Art. 108.

(1) The candidates declared admitted have the obligation to submit to the faculty secretariat the baccalaureate diploma / the certificate of recognition of the diploma / the baccalaureate certificate in original, no later than the date of confirmation of the place for the first year and, if applicable:

a) University graduation diploma or a certificate proving graduation for those applying to attend another faculty, including specification of the status under which the first degree was completed (state-funded or fee-paid).

b) For candidates who are still students at another faculty, a certificate specifying the status (state-funded or fee-paying) of the previously attended studies.

(2) The high school graduation certificate (baccalaureate certificate) is valid only for candidates who passed the baccalaureate exam in the sessions of the current school year.

(3) Failure to present the original baccalaureate diploma / diploma recognition certificate / baccalaureate certificate, due solely to the admitted candidate, within the deadline established by this regulation, will result in the loss of the state-funded place.

(4) The presentation of the original baccalaureate diploma shall be made mandatory within the validity period of the certificate for the candidates admitted on the state funded places, and those who have submitted the baccalaureate diploma, in original, to another study program / faculty / university shall submit, within the validity period of the certificate, a certified copy for the conformity with the original, of the baccalaureate diploma.

(5) The failure of declaration the previously followed studies in state funded places, leads to the loss of the state funded places and the obligation to pay the equivalent value of the schooling services from which he benefited, according to the methodology approved by the Order of the Minister of Education no. 5496/2024 of July 9, 2024.

Art. 109.

(1) The candidates declared admitted and confirmed are enrolled in the first year of study based on the results of the entrance exam, by the decision of the Rector and based of the enrollment contract. The university study contract, completed and signed by the candidates declared admitted, can also be submitted online, with the obligation to submit the original by the beginning of the academic year.

(2) After the approval of enrollment, students are enrolled in the Single Enrollment Register of Universities in Romania (RMUR; until the operationalization of the Single National Integrated Register of Diplomas and Study Documents – RUNIDAS) with a unique number, valid for the entire period of enrollment at the study program/programs to which they were admitted.

Chapter X. Information on Admission to the Architecture Study Program in English language

X.I. Admission Contest Tests

Art. 110.

(1) The admission contest to the Architecture in English study program in G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș will be tested the following specific qualities and aptitudes of the candidates:

- vision in space,
- creativity,



- imagination,
- specialized general culture,
- the ability for graphic representation in two and three dimensions.

(2) The admission competition – testing the candidates' skills and aptitudes – will consist of the evaluation of the practical graphic representation test, taken by the candidate at the premises of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș.

(3) The practical test of graphic representation shall include a number of exercises, with equal or different weight of assessment, which shall be written on a single sheet, 50x70 cm format, in a representation technique specified in the statement of the competition subject.

(4) The requirements of the exercises shall be written in English.

(5) Graphical representation means the observational and/or imagination drawing that aims to test the ability to perceive, understand and represent a subject, an object, a group of objects, elements of built spaces, as well as the ability to understand and represent correctly and explicitly geometric volumes or spatial shapes, using representation conventions.

(6) The candidates shall also take an eliminatory test of linguistic competences for the English language, evaluated with a grade of Pass/Fail or, as the case may be, shall submit at the registration stage a certificate of linguistic competences (English) in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation. In the assessment of language competences, the following will be taken into account: language competence certificates (FCE level B2; CAE level C1; CAMBRIDGE PROFICIENCY level C2; TOEFL; IELTS minimum level 5 – level B2; ECL level B2, C1, C2; FIDES level B2, C1, C2), full high school education in English, prizes obtained at national English language Olympiads.

(7) The general admission average shall be calculated as a weighted average of two decimal places of:

- The average of the baccalaureate exam – representing 30% of the general admission average,
- The grade obtained at the admission contest – representing 70% of the general admission average.

(8) The general admission average, calculated to two decimal places, for the bachelor's degree studies within UMPHST G.E. Palade Târgu Mureș must be at least 6.00 (six).

Art. 111.

(1) The materials and tools necessary for the candidates for the admission test are:

- graphite pencil (HB-B, 2B, 3B, 4B);
- coloured pencils;
- eraser;
- plastic eraser;
- graduated ruler;
- soldering tape, pions, soldering paste;
- blue ink pen, paste pen (black or blue);
- 1.20 m „T” liner;



- equestrian at 45° and 60°, protractor, flourish;
- compass with black pencil;
- cutter.

(2) The duration of the competition test shall be established by the commission depending on the difficulty of the subjects, but shall not exceed 3 hours.

(3) During the admission tests, all candidates will be provided with the same working conditions.

(4) In order to offer the same conditions to the candidates for the admission competition G.E. Palade. UMPHST of Târgu Mureș shall provide each candidate with the drawing paper/sheets at the assigned places in the competition rooms.

(5) On the day of the admission competition, it is strictly forbidden for candidates to access the headquarters of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș with mobile phones, electronic tablets or other electronic communication or data storage devices. Candidates who do not comply with this provision are excluded from the competition.

Art. 112.

(1) The preparation of the subjects for the practical tests of the competition is the exclusive task and responsibility of G.E. Palade. UMPHST of Târgu Mureș.

(2) The Rector appoints by decision a Commission for the preparation of the subjects.

(3) When elaborating the topics, the members of the commission will take into account the specifications contained in Art. 110. The topics proposed for the competition topics will be accompanied by:

- evaluation criteria;
- estimation of the necessary working time.

(4) On the day prior to the practical tests of the admission competition, the lists containing the distribution of the candidates on the rooms, the entrance through which they will be accessed, as well as the period in which the candidates' access to the competition room is allowed, will be displayed on the website of UMFST G.E. Palade Târgu Mureș and physically, in the posting space of the university, until 18.00.

(5) Candidates who have not arrived in the competition rooms by the time the subject envelope is opened do not have access to the admission exams, regardless of the reason for the delay.

(6) On the days of the admission competition, any kind of teaching activities in the university are suspended, until the end of the admission tests.

(7) Before the start of the tests, the members of the Central Admission Commission (in groups of at least two people) will hand over to the room managers, in the competition rooms, the sealed envelopes containing the subjects.

(8) The exam room supervisors check the integrity of the seals in front of the candidates, and at the scheduled time, they open the envelopes, distribute the exam papers, and announce and write the duration of the test on the board.

(9) During the entire duration of the test, the candidate may not leave the place reserved for them, except in case of strict necessity, in which case he will be accompanied by a member of the supervisory staff.



(10) After the allotted time has expired, the exam paper will be secured by the room supervisor in charge; each candidate will submit their paper and sign for confirmation in front of the room supervisor.

Art. 113. In the scoring process, in addition to the evaluation criteria established for each competition subject, the following will be evaluated:

- understanding and writing topic data;
- the correctness of the resolution of the subjects;
- the correctness of the used representations and graphic constructions;
- the expressiveness and accuracy of the drawing;
- the composition of balanced compositions;
- suggesting the characteristics of the materials (where applicable);
- sense of observation and proportions;
- capacity for imaginative creativity and inventiveness;
- the correctness of the representation;
- page layout

X.II. Ranking of candidates

Art. 114.

(1) The ranking of the candidates for the admission competition shall be made in descending order of the general admission averages, expressed from grade 10.00 to grade 1.00. Admission will be made within the limit of the places approved by the M.EC.

(2) In the event of a tie in the overall admission average for candidates ranked in the last place, the tie will be broken based on the grade obtained in the admission exam, with the candidate achieving the highest grade being declared admitted. If these grades are also equal, the tie will be broken based on the sum of the highest and lowest grades obtained in the Baccalaureate exams, with the candidate having the highest total being declared admitted.

(3) If an admitted candidate renounces the student status obtained through the admission process (by withdrawing the registration file or by failing to appear by the registration deadline announced in the calendar), the vacant place will be filled according to the order of preferences and the overall admission average, as follows:

- by one of the rejected candidates with the general admission average equal to that of the last one declared admitted;
- by one of the rejected candidates with an overall admission average equal to or higher than the minimum admissible overall admission average of 6.00 (six), considering the list in strictly descending order of averages.

(4) The final result of the competition shall be communicated by displaying the ranking of the candidates.

X.III. Appeals

Art. 115.

(1) The resolution of appeals is exclusively the competence of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș, according to this admission regulation. The decision of the Appeals Commission is final.



(2) Appeals regarding the results of the admission competition shall be submitted in writing, to the faculty secretariat and shall be resolved within the deadline provided in the G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș Calendar.

(3) G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș is the only one to decide on the solidity of the appeals. The rector will designate the Appeals Commission by a written decision.

(4) Appeals may concern only procedural issues regarding the manner of recording and transmitting the notes from the lists of juries to the central list. The notation itself cannot be appealed, as it is the result of a collective decision, in accordance with the international judging system.

(5) The candidate whose appeal has been resolved favorably acquires the status of student if he obtains a final admission grade higher (or equal, in compliance with the tie-breaking criteria) than the last candidate initially admitted.

(6) The validity of the modification of the final average for the candidate whose appeal was favorably resolved, as well as bringing him to the corresponding position in the ranking of candidates, according to the order of the options and the final admission marks, is made with all the consequences arising from it.

(7) The results of the university education admission contest are verified and approved by the Central Admission Commission and are made public by posting them on the university's website.

(8) The list of candidates declared admitted following the admission exam becomes final upon the posting of the final lists, which include the results of any appeals and the redistribution of any remaining (unoccupied) places.

(9) If, after the list of the admitted candidates has been finalized, there is a significant number of not occupied places in the first session, a second admission session may be organized in September.

Chapter XI. Final provisions

Art. 116. The admission calendar is adopted every year, by the Decision of the Administrative Board and is posted on the university's website (www.umfst.ro, [Adminfo.umfst.ro platform](http://Adminfo.umfst.ro)).

Art. 117. The staff trained to the admission competition do not engage in discussions and do not give information or express their opinion towards candidates, parents, etc., except within absolute official limits. Any problem that arises will be reported to the Admission Commission, which is the single competent to decide and communicate the necessary solution.

Art. 118. Particular attention is drawn to maintaining discipline during the admission exam and responding promptly to the requests of the Admission Committee.

Art. 119. It is also required thorough knowledge and rigorously comply with the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Research, as well as those specific to the university, so as to avoid misunderstandings and disruptions during the conduct of the exam.

Art. 120. The Regulation was developed on the basis of the general criteria of the Ministry of Education and Research regarding the organization and conduct of the admission contest in higher education and the aspects generated by the experience of G.E. Palade UMPHST of Târgu Mureș in the organization and conduct of such a contest.

The Senate of the "George Emil Palade" University of Medicine, Pharmacy, Sciences and Technology of Târgu Mureș approved the amendments in this edition of the regulation on February 13, 2026 and enters into force on February 14, 2026.
